Context

The huge increase in the production of data represents a unique opportunity to understand the dynamics of sustainable development for different dimensions of society, from buyer behavior to the effects of the loss of forest on indigenous people. However, it also brings significant challenges that go beyond having data, for example, identifying vulnerable groups requires attention to build a more inclusive society that focuses its efforts on "Leaving no one behind".

Debates around inclusive data continue to evolve with reflections on how data can be better used to address inequalities and focus efforts on marginalized people. There remain normative questions around the ethics and values of data, with particular attention being paid to governance mechanisms to facilitate data collection, including consultations with data producers and users.

To inform more effective public policies, Inclusive data must be used by decision-makers. Therefore, issues around data disaggregation and inclusiveness can be contemplated from two perspectives: from the Statistical Office which coordinates data production, governance and quality, but also the policy and decision-making led by government agencies specialized in the issues or other users from different sectors.

The Global Partnership for Sustainable Development Data (GPSDD), the Ministry of Planning and Economic Policy of Costa Rica (MIDEPLAN) and the National Administrative Department of Statistics of Colombia (DANE), have joined forces to promote a dialogue with statisticians and policy makers on inclusive data for sustainable development in the framework of the ECLAC Regional Forum 2022.

Objectives

- Discuss how collaboration/participation of civil society and communities is important to inclusive data and data disaggregation commitments required for the SDG monitoring.
- Share the progress and challenges in data disaggregation by the participating countries.
- Disseminate practical examples of joint work between producers of inclusive data and the generation of public policies.
